No charge for a function using the bar at Club prices and paying the bar staff wages.







Hints to Bowlers

How to become a better player

The following advice, first issued to bowlers many years ago is as sound as ever today:

- In rink play do not divide your attention with another rink. It may affect play in your own, and cannot possibly enhance it's character.
- 2. Impart, if possible, a little enthusiasm into your efforts, Dull play makes a dull day.
- 3. If you make a fluke, admit it. It is known, whether you do or not.
- 4. Get off the mat when you have delivered your bowl; remember "there are others".
- 5. Practice assiduously until the time arrives then you recognise you have something yet to learn. This will be your bowling Soul's Awakening.
- Particularly practise "guarding" or "blocking" – the second most useful shot on the bowling green, but too little cultivated.
- 7. Make the "half through" (the most useful shot) a habit, and if cultivated successfully you will make your position in pennant game sure.
- 8. If the shot be against you. DO NOT BE SHORT.
- 9. As a rule get a little beyond, rather than a little short of the jack.
- 10. Be kind to beginners: you were once one yourself.
- 11. Never assume you cannot do a shot for which your skipper asks. Confidence is often akin to performance.
- 12. Support, always, promotion by merit only.

There you have the 12 Commandments for better bowling, team.

"Now follow him up, don't kill the end, I like your style – all the way – now bend."


The skipper moves out to show the track, "Now give me one round the back."
